JOB SUMMARY

The Learning Specialist plays a key role in the Assessment Department at MCYAF. S/he will work directly with children and youth who have been diagnosed with learning disabilities by our Assessment Psychologist. This position works collaboratively with all the staff at MCYAF.

The position will be responsible for creating an individual learning plan for each child, scheduling tutoring sessions and evaluating student progress.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

The position is responsible for:

- Attending treatment planning conferences and providing collaborative feedback regarding learning intervention recommendations and referrals
- Working directly with children referred for learning intervention
- Creating individual learning plans for each child on the caseload
- Scheduling sessions
- Documenting progress
- Providing feedback to the team and to the parents of active cases
- Other duties necessary to ensure customer satisfaction, clinical excellence, continuity of care and the success of MCYAF.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

The Learning Specialist/Educational should have a Master's Degree in Education/Special Ed. Additionally, comprehensive training in multisensory structured language education and executive functioning is required. She/he must have a minimum of 5 years' experience providing specialized learning interventions. The Learning Specialist must be able to work collaboratively

with a multi-disciplinary team and have extensive training, knowledge and experience in child development.
